Platypus genome sequenced

The genome sequence of the duck-billed platypus has been determined. It is just as weird at the genome level as it is anatomically. It has both mammalian and reptilian features in its genome. There is an article in *Nature* about the interesting stuff being found in the genome (unfortunately, you need a subscription to read it, unless you go to a library that subscribes, like UCSC). You can find tidbits from the article by searching news with Google for "platypus".

The UCSC genome browser at genome.ucsc.edu has the platypus genome as one of the 20 vertebrate genomes that they analyze and display.
